STATEMENT OF ISSUE

CRTPA COMMITTEE ACTIONS

The Citizen's Multimodal Advisory Committee (CMAC) and the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) met on June 4, 2024, and recommended Board adoption of the FY 2026— FY 2030 Project Priority Lists with revisions, with the exception of the Urban Area Attributable PPL, which is included for Board action. At the meeting staff informed the committees the PPLs were in draft form and would be finalized for the Board meeting. Since the committees' review, staff refined the project details associated with the Capital City Trails project, No. 3.

BACKGROUND

The CRTPA annually adopts project priority lists that identify the ranked order of projects for which the agency is seeking transportation funding. Projects lists are developed for all modes of transportation. The CRTPA develops these lists in coordination with our modal partners, StarMetro and the Tallahassee International Airport, and state and local governments.

BACKGROUND (CONT.)

Projects contained on the lists are established in the Connections 2045 Regional Mobility Plan; StarMetro's Transit Development Plan; Tallahassee International Airport's Aviation Master Plan; Regional Transportation Management Center's Intelligent Transportation Master Plan; and safety and multi-modal plans adopted by local governments in the CRTPA Region. For Board consideration the Urban Attributable (SU) Project Priority List is included. SU funds are allocated to the CRTPA as Transportation Management Area (TMA) and are used for planning, operations, project development and implementation.

PROJECT PRIORITY CHANGES

- 1) Roadways PPL: Project Priority No.2, Capital Circle SW from Crawfordville Road to Springhill Road is fully funded and is removed from the list. The new No. 2 project is Crawfordville Road from East Ivan to Wakulla Aaron Road and subsequent projects all move up a ranking.
- 2) <u>Bike-Ped PPL:</u> Project Priority No. 3, Wakulla Springs Trail Extension, Wakulla Springs State Park to Springhill Road, replaces the previous priority, Old St. Augustine Road sidewalk project is fully funded for construction in FY 2025.
- 3) Regional Trails Project Priority PPL: This project list has been revamped. Trail Projects in Leon, Gadsden and Jefferson Counties are now presented as the Capital City Trail system, East, Central and West. Changes in the ranking are also proposed. Priority projects No. 1 and 2 are switched, making the SR 267 Trail No. 1 and the US 90 Trail No. 2. Priority project No. 3 is expanded to provide better detail related to the separate trail projects with the Blueprint Intergovernmental Agency and the CRTPA collaborating on developing this network.
- 4) Intelligent Transportation Systems PPL: There are no changes to the list.
- 5) <u>Tallahassee International Airport PPL:</u> The list is updated to reflect funded priorities and project funding.
- 6) <u>StarMetro PPL:</u> Project Priority Nos. 1, 2, and 3 are removed as these are fully funded. Phase II of the Electric Bus Charging infrastructure is added along with a new priority project for the expansion of the StarMetro administrative facility.
- 7) <u>Urban Attributable Funds (SU) PPL:</u> This list reflects the annual priority of funding for the CRTPA's Unified Planning Work Program for operational expenses and project development.

The Transportation Systems Management and Safety (TSM&S) PPL is not proposed for adoption at this time. Staff will reevaluate the feasibility of moving the three remaining projects forward, as well as identifying any new projects that support the safety and operations of the system and that can be completed in the short-term.

PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT

One virtual and two in-person public meetings were held to present the Draft FY 2025— FY 2029 TIP and the FY 2026 — FY 2030 Project Priority Lists (PPLs). These meetings provide the public an opportunity to learn about the CRTPA's programs and plans. Comment was solicited for both the TIP and PPLs.

Under the current public involvement plan a meeting must be conducted in one rural county and one in a location with access to public transportation. A meeting was held in Wakulla County at the library in the late afternoon to early evening. The second in-person meeting was held late morning through lunchtime at the Renaissance Center (Leon County). The final virtual meeting, also held at lunchtime, was conducted virtually on Teams.

These meetings were noticed in the local papers for each county, including an ad in both the Gadsden County Times and the Havana Herald. An advertisement was placed in the local paper of circulation for each county, as well posting the notice on the CRTPA website. The notice was published in each county's local newspaper, distributed to the CRTPA's committees and the Board, the Community Traffic Safety Teams, local governments and the emailed to the CRTPA contact list of stakeholders and citizens. The CRTPA and Wakulla County staff promoted the event on their Facebook page and by email.

At the Wakulla County meeting, Wakulla County administration and planning staff attended, as well as members of the Planning Commission and Community Traffic Safety Team. A few Wakulla County citizens attended and expressed interest in knowing when the existing SR 267 widening project would be completed, concerns about environmental impacts of future construction, and a strong interest in seeing the widening of Crawfordville Road in both Wakulla and Leon counties. Appendix G of the FY 2025— FY 2029 TIP includes the publication notices for the meetings, materials, and meeting attendance. In addition, a citizen commented in support of the number one bike-ped priority project, Thomasville Road Shares-Use Path. Please see Attachment 8 for comments received on the PPLs.

NEXT STEPS

Subsequent Board adoption of the CRTPA FY 2026 – FY 2030 PPLs, the lists are provided to the FDOT for consideration in the development of next year's Five-Year Work Program. In the fall of 2024, the FDOT will present the Draft Tentative Work Program for FY 2026 – FY 2030. After the Draft Tentative Work Program is released CRTPA staff initiates development of the CRTPA's FY 2026 – FY 2030 Transportation Improvement Program, incorporating the transportation projects in the CRTPA region that have received federal, state, and local funding.
